#### ARTIST STATEMENT

My artwork is about the topic of depression. Each piece of the work is a representation of what I've learned about depression. On the outer layer there is a row of broken skewers. They represent how, when a person is depressed, they keep everyone away from what they feel. Then there's a heart. In the centre of the heart there is a black stone. It represents the cause or reason the person is depressed, which is why it's in the centre. The final part of the piece are the black lines inside the heart. They represent how depression slowly takes over your life. I chose to work on depression because it is a very serious mental illness and social issue.





On Wednesday we made a GIGANTIC picture of an egg. It took co-operation for us to put it together and colour it in. We missed our friends who were not at school so when we were making the egg we got to interact with other people from all different year levels at our school. It felt like we were making new friends.




