This funding will be used to

- Increase the percentage of students achieving school reading benchmarks to 65%(P-3) and 70% (Year 4 to 6).
- Increase the percentage of students in P to Year 2 achieving a C or better on the school report card to 75%.
- Maintain and extend the consistency of metalanguage across the school.

Our initiatives include

- o Continued development and consolidation of:
 - Systematic Curriculum Delivery and Effective Pedagogical Practices through:
 - Building deep curriculum knowledge of the Australian Curriculum and high yield pedagogical practices across the school
 - School based moderation and cluster moderation to align consistencies of teacher judgement
 - Precise planning at whole school, year plan and unit planning
 - Developing and extending staff data literacy skills to analyse data, plan for the next step of learning for the student
 - Developing, implementing and reflecting on the Inala SS reading and curriculum framework.
 - Expert Teaching Team
 - Developing and implementing a collegial engagement policy to include observations and feedback to staff
 - Continuing Golden Hour time for teaching staff to enhance collaboration and engage in professional conversations
 - Introducing weekly professional development (in house) for Education Support Staff to upskill and develop consistency across the school.
 - Differentiated Teaching and Learning
 - Collaboratively developing an Inclusion policy, including a school vision for inclusion
 - Introducing a Case Mangement process across the school to have high expectations for students.
